

# YOUR FIRST-YEAR *Experience*



Within your First-Year, as a Freshman, we will help you become familiar with University Life. You would learn common terms and acronyms use on campus by your peers and the staff. Here are a few:

## Common Terms & Acronyms

### GPA

Stands for grade point average. This is a reflection of your academic achievement at school. The GPA is updated after each term's grades are finalized and reported. A low GPA can lead to academic probation and can jeopardize financial aid.

### Course Code

A Course Code is a 5-digit alphanumeric code that is generated and assigned to the courses created by your institution. Course codes describe and organize courses in a way that can be easily understood by both colleges and students

### Add/Drop Period

A grace period at the beginning of each semester during which you can decide to add or drop a course with no penalty.

### Prerequisite

Many college classes must be taken sequentially – in a certain order, from lower to higher level. A prerequisite is a course a student must complete before taking another specific course. E.g. Calculus 1 is a prerequisite to Calculus 2 – a student can't take the latter without having passed the former.

### Transfer Credits

Credits that can be transferred from previous school and applied towards your current degree/programme

### Credit/s

A form of measurement most universities use to indicate to weight a course worth. Each degree has a number the credits needed to be completed. Each course has a various credit amounts.

### Aeorion

Aeorion is our Student Management System that collects and manages our students personal and academic information

### Midterms

Exams that occur in the middle of a quarter or semester to test a student's grasp of topics covered in a course up to that point. Midterms are typically weighted more heavily than other tests and coursework, but not as heavily as finals.

### Dean of School

The person in charge of a university department (School). Is the authorized individual, in charge of student affairs and activities for your specific school.

### Transcript

A transcript is an overview of a student's academic progress – it includes names and grades for all completed courses, their GPA and their total credit hours.

**NOTE:** The number of credits are an estimate and relative to each programme. Also not taking Minors into consideration



### Senior Credits (97+)

1. Fill out Graduation Contract.
2. Ensure all requirements are completed



### Junior Credits (65-96)

1. Transfer Credits placed on transcript
2. Fill out Intention to Graduate Form
3. Complete all required petitions
4. Review Audit, sent from Academic Auditor.



### Sophomore Credits (33-64)

1. Declare Emphasis
2. Change of Program (If required)
3. Ensure Regular Status



### Freshman Credits (03-32)

1. Ensure demographic data is accurate
2. Submit CXC/CSEC CERTIFICATES (If applicable)
3. Apply for Transfer Credits (If applicable)

- 2. Completed GATE Application (GATE Students only) - Means test section must be completed.**

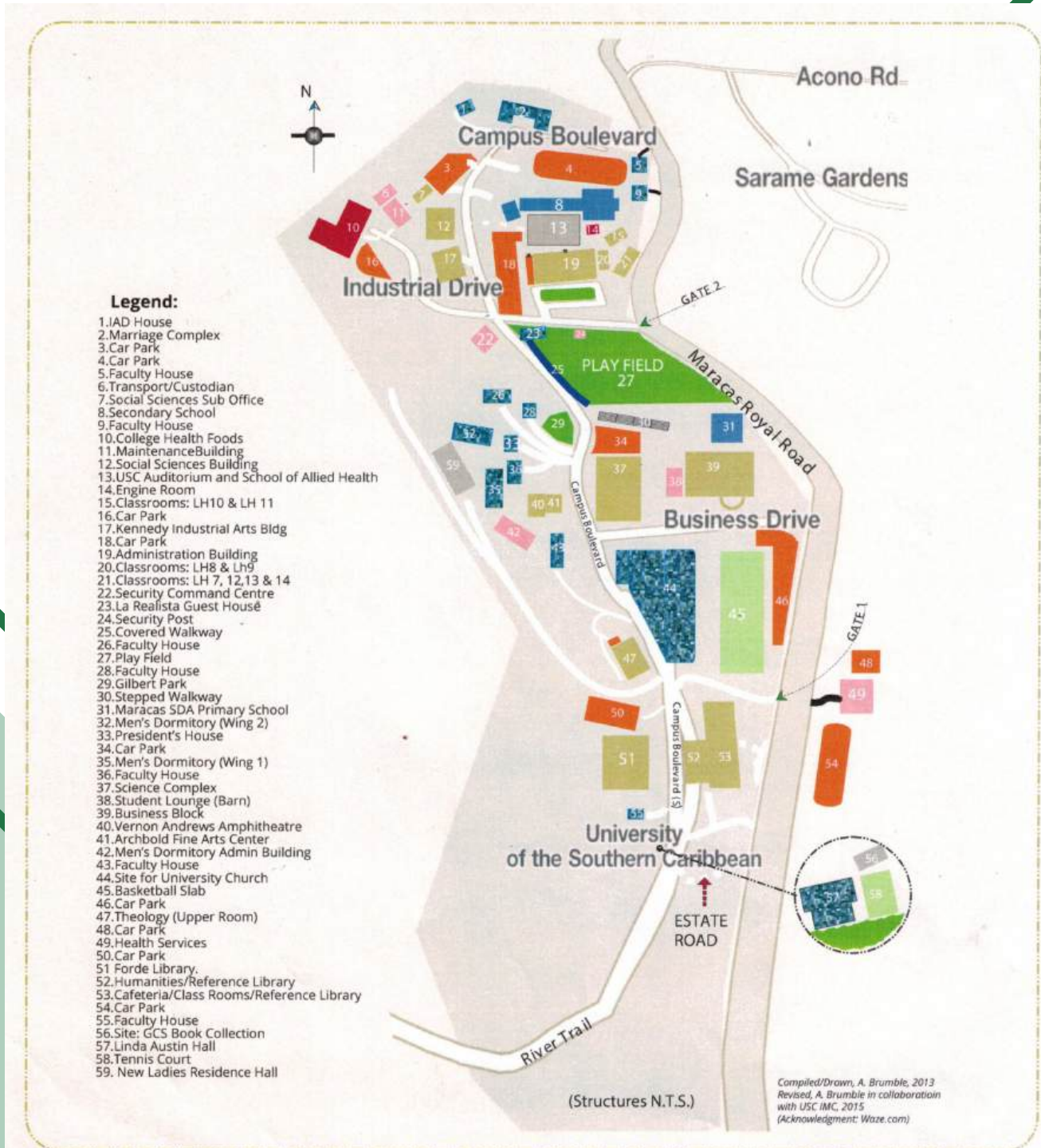
